WoChe Haemodialysis Centre

Set up in 1994 with a donation by Hong Kong Jockey Club
The centre has 15 haemodialysis stations
to provide hameodialysis treatment for up to 78 patients.

Kowloon City Haemodialysis Centre

was set up in 1981 with a donation by Mr. Li Ka Shing.

The centre is now closed due to the damage by two typhoons in 2017.

All the patients at the KC centre were transferred to WoChe Haemodialysis centre.

Clinical support (1a) In-center Haemodialysis

Patients with end-stage kidney failure who require haemodialsyis treatment are referred by kidney specialists from the Hospital Authority or private sector.

Patient needs 2-3 treatments per week.

With subsidy provided by HKKF,
the cost to receive treatment at HKKF
is around HK\$1100-1200 (US\$140-150) per session.

Clinical support (1b) In-center Hospital Authority Share Care Haemodialysis

HKKF supports the "Share Care program" offered for patients under the care of Hospital Authority.

A public-private partnership program

The purpose is to allow patients to receive treatment in local community setting.

Clinical support (2) **Nocturnal Home Haemodialysis**



A self-care programme with the treatment being performed by patient at home overnight on 3 to 4 nights per week.

Clinical support (2) **Nocturnal Home Haemodialysis**





August 2006
First patient in Hong Kong
to receive nocturnal home hamodialysis.

HKKF provides a monthly subsidy of HK\$3000 (US\$385) to support the patient.

Hospital Authority provides the consumables.

The cost to the patient is about HK\$3000/ month.

HKKF will support up to 60 patients.

A look back at the haemodialysis service

- Over the past 40 years has provided haemodialysis treatment for 600+ patients
- Accepting about 20 new patients every year
 - Currently around 65 patients are on the in-centre haemodialysis program and 52 patients on home haemodialysis, Amounting to 7000+ sessions of haemodialysis treatment every year.

Clinical support (3) **Automated Peritoneal Dialysis (APD)**



Free loaning of an APD machine.

APD is a self-care treatment performed by patient at home every night. Before going to bed, the patient connects himself onto the APD machine, the machine will perform the dialysis automatically overnight while the patient is asleep. In the morning, the patient takes himself off from the machine, thus able to maintain a normal life during the daytime.

Most patients cannot afford an APD machine at HK\$84,000, (US\$10,700). HKKF will loan an APD machine to a patient free of charge, if he/she meets the criteria (based on financial assessment).

A look back at the APD program





Since 1997, HKKF has procured 727 APD machines through donation of cash or machine, equivalent of HK\$61 millions (US\$2.15 millions)

HKKF has supported **1,715** patients with free loaning of an APD machine, on average for 3-4 years, some to 10 years.

Currently, HKKF has **558** APD machines for free loaning to patients.

A special donation (June 2019)

A donation of HK\$16.8 millions (US\$2.15 millions) from Hong Kong Jockey Club to purchase **200** Automated Peritoneal Machines over the next 3 years.

- 140 as replacement for 10 years old machines
- 60 as new machines.

Home Automated Peritoneal Dialysis machine Co-Funding Co-Use program

- The Co-Funding Co-Use (CFCU) program is for patients electing Automated Peritoneal Dialysis as the preferred modality of dialysis treatment.
- If a patient does not qualify for the free loaning of an APD machine from HKKF, they can elect to join the CFCU program.
- The patient is to contribute HK\$2800 (US\$360) per month to the CFCU Fund, for a maximum duration of 30 months.

 After 30 months, he/she can continue to use the machine without further contribution untill he/she no longer needs to use the machine.
- On average, a patient may use the machine for 3-4 years, some up to 10 years.

Home Automated Peritoneal Dialysis machine Co-Funding Co-Use program

- On 1 Jan 2020, HKKF launched the CFCU program with the donation of 10 APD machines by a donor and 5 APD machines by Baxter Healthcare Ltd Hong Kong.
 On 23 April 2020, the Estate of late Cheung Ching Lan donated HK\$4.2 million for HKKF to procure another 50 APD machines for the program.
- The contributions by the patients to the CFCU Fund will enable HKKF to procure APD machines as required on a regular basis, as the contributing of \$2800/month for 30 months will amount to \$84,000 to buy another APD machine for the program. CFCU is a self-sustain program.
- It is projected the initial donation of HK\$5 millions (US\$641,000) to procure 60 APD machines may generate up to HK\$25 millions (US\$3.2 millions) for the CUCF Fund, enable the program to expand to a pool of 280+ APD machines, serving 400+ patients over 6 years.

Clinical support (4) **Drug subsidize program**

Drugs for kidney transplant and renal anaemia

With the support by pharmaceutical companies, a cumulative donation of HK\$9.4m (US\$1.2m)), HKKF supports patients to purchase self-paid drugs cover 50% of the drug cost, amounting to HK\$6,000 - \$24,000 (US\$770-3,070) per patient per year







Kidney Transplantation in Hong Kong – 50 years. The past and the Future

7 March 2020

Hong Kong Kidney Foundation, Hong Kong Society of Nephrology & Hong Kong Association of Renal Nurses set up the COVID-19 Hong Kong Kidney Patient Support Fund and Program to support patients facing difficult and financial burden to obtain surgical masks.

HK\$1,000,000 was raised with the strong support from our partners / and pharmaceutical companies, enable the project to purchase 300,000 surgical masks, to provide each of the 11,000 patients on renal replacement therapy under Hospital Authority and at charitable centres with 25 surgical masks.




