CLINICAL SERVICE

(1) HAEMODIALYSIS SERVICE

In-centre haemodialysis

WoChe Centre (WCC) provides haemodialysis for patients with end-stage kidney failure. The centre, with 14 stations operating 12 half-day shifts per week, can provide treatment for up to 67 patients.

The COVID outbreak has seriously affected the WCC's operations. HKKF placed the safety of our staff and patients (with regard to the prevention of infection) as a top priority. An extensive range of infection control measures against the spread of COVID was

introduced, including installing air purifiers with HEPA-filters, and the regular testing of patients and staff with a rapid antigen test. These measures have prevented any outbreak of COVID cases at WCC up to the time of this report.

As of 30 June 2022, 48 patients were receiving haemodialysis at WCC, of which 28 were HKKF patients receiving subsidized treatment and 20 were patients from the Hospital Authority's Public-Private Partnership



Programme. The utilization rate of the available sessions was 75%, as the number of patients had been reduced to avoid overcrowding at WCC.

Since March 2010, HKKF has supported the Hospital Authority Haemodialysis Public-Private Partnership Programme (PPP), providing haemodialysis for patients referred and funded by the Hospital Authority.

In 2021, 6,237 haemodialysis sessions were provided, 3,544 of which were used by HKKF patients, with the remaining 2,547 sessions taken up by the PPP. The operation cost was approximately HK\$1,800 per session. The fee charged was between HK\$1,155 and HK\$1,455 per session (depending on the type of dialysis and the dialyser used). HKKF subsidised each patient to the sum of approximately HK\$66,000 per year, amounting to HK\$2 million for the whole in-centre haemodialysis each year.

HKKF received a donation of HK\$2 million from The Joseph Lau Luen Hung Charitable Foundation Limited to support the WCC's operation costs of for 2021-2022. HKKF received HK\$384,000 from HKSAR Employment Support Scheme 2022 and HK\$490,000 from the Jockey Club COVID Emergency Fund II to help fund the infection control measures in 2022.

Nocturnal home haemodialysis (NHHD)



Since 2007, HKKF has supported the **NHHD programme** run by the Hospital Authority for patients to perform self-care haemodialysis at home overnight, 3-4 nights per week.

Clinical outcome and rehabilitation offer better results than the conventional twice or thrice weekly haemodialysis sessions, with improvement in blood pressure control, anaemia reduction, and general blood test results.

HKKF provides each patient with a subsidy of HK\$3,000 per month. The Hospital Authority provides the consumables for the patient. The patient has to contribute around HK\$2,000 per month.

HKKF will support up to 60 patients on NHHD. Currently, 49 patients are supported by HKKF, with a subsidy amounting to HK\$2 million per year.

HKKF received a donation of HK\$2 million from the Li Ka Shing Foundation to support the programme for 2021 and HK\$2 million for 2022.

CLINICAL SERVICE

(2) AUTOMATED PERITONEAL DIALYSIS



The Automated Peritoneal Dialysis (APD) programme was launched in 1997 for patients who would benefit from a form of peritoneal dialysis that can be carried out at home by the patient (with or without a care-giver) every night, with the APD machines performing the automated treatment throughout the night. This mode of dialysis is suitable for patients who are working during the daytime and for patients who require a care-giver to perform the dialysis. APD is an alternative mode of dialysis to Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis, in which the patient needs to perform the fluid exchange 3-4 times throughout the day.

Since 1997, HKKF has procured 1148 APD machines (the equivalent of HK\$96.5 million in value) via the donation of funds or machines. In 2021, 219 APD machines were procured / donated to HKKF, of which 100 were donations from Baxter Healthcare.

Since its launch, HKKF has supported 2,274 patients. On average, each patient receives APD treatment for three to four years, with some needing treatment for up to ten years. During 2021, HKKF approved 300 applications for the APD programme.

HKKF has two APD programmes — **APD Free-loan programme** and the **APD Co-Fund, Co-Use programme**. The patient uses the APD machine at home every night.



Free APD Free-loan programme

The programme is for patients who meet the financial assessment criteria for free-loan of an APD machine (a patient whose household income is not significantly higher than the median monthly household income, according to the HKSAR Domestic households Survey).

The programme is supported by generous donations from individuals, organisations, pharmaceutical firms, and philanthropies (see Acknowledgement).

The donation of HK\$16.8 million by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust in June 2019 for HKKF spreading over three years to replace the old APD machines (in service for 10+ years).

Since 1997, HKKF has supported 2148 patients for the APD Free-loan programme. For 2021, 235 applications for the APD Free-loan programme were approved.

Home Automated Peritoneal Dialysis machine Co-Fund Co-Use programme (CFCU)

HKKF launched the CFCU programme on 1 Jan 2020 with the donation of HK\$840,000 by a donor to procure 10 APD machines which was matched by the donation of 5 APD machines by Baxter Healthcare Ltd. On 23 April 2020, the Estate of the late Cheung Ching Lan donated HK\$4.2 million for HKKF to procure another 50 APD machines for the programme and matching donation by Baxter Healthcare.

The CFCU programme caters for patients who do not meeting the HKKF criteria for free loan of an APD machine. These patients can apply to join the CFCU programme on condition that they contribute HK\$2,333 per month to the CFCU Fund, for a maximum duration of 36 months. On completion of the 36 months, the patient can continue to use the machine

without further contributions to the CFCU. On average, a patient may use the machine for three to four years, with some patients using the APD machines up to 10 years or more. The machine is the property of HKKF and is re-circulated for use by patients for up to 10 years.

The contribution by a patient of HK\$2,333/month for 36 months (HK\$84,000) to the CFCU Fund enables HKKF to procure another APD machine for the CFCU programme, making it self-sustaining programme.

As of 30 June 2022, 126 patients have joined the CFCU programme and have contributed HK\$3.39 million to the CFCU fund. Currently, there are 104 patients in the programme.

(3) SUPPORTING PROGRAMMES FOR EXPENSIVE MEDICATIONS

Anti-rejection drugs for kidney transplantation – Prograf VI charity programme

Astellas Pharma Hong Kong Company Limited has donated a total of HK\$8.28 million (in accumulation since 2006 for the Prograf I-VI programmes) to HKKF to support patients requiring Prograf for kidney trans-

plantation. HKKF provides the patient with a subsidy of 50% of the cost of the drug. The programme has supported a total of 325 patients. As of 30 June 2022, 8 patients are on Prograf VI programme.

Erythropoietin for end-stage kidney failure patients (NESP)

Kyowa Kirin Hong Kong Company Limited has donated a total of HK\$2 million (accumulated since 2013) to HKKF to support patients with anaemia due

to end-stage kidney failure. As of 30 June 2022, 483 patients were supported (for 50% of the cost of the drugs).

EDUCATION AND RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

FOR HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

○ **Central Commissioned Training Programme 19-20 Jan 2022**

HKKF supported a 2-day programme organised by Hospital Authority. The topic for 2022 was “Management of elderly with chronic kidney disease – keys to achieving the best outcome.” The training was attended by 971 healthcare professionals.

○ **HKKF Fellowship**

Since 1995, HKKF has awarded Fellowship funds to 27 renal healthcare professionals (doctors and nurses) to receive overseas training. The COVID outbreak has led to a temporary suspension.

○ **HKKF Eugenia Lee Education Scholarship**

HKKF received a donation of HK\$1,000,000 from Ms. Eugenia Lee in 2013 to establish a scholarship for healthcare professionals to attend overseas courses in nephrology. A total of 29 doctors have been granted scholarships.

Due to COVID-19, HKKF has supported online programmes for healthcare staff. HKKF supported 7 healthcare professionals to attend the 20th Congress of the International Society of Renal Nutrition and Metabolism.

○ **Renal Nursing Course 2021-2022**


HKKF supported the course organized by the HA Institute of Advanced Nursing, commenced on 26 March 2021 for 56 attendees from the Hospital Authority. The course was interrupted due to COVID-19 and was resumed in June 2022.

○ **HKKF Renal Research Grant**

In conjunction with the Hong Kong Society of Nephrology, HKKF awarded a Renal Research Grant of HK\$60,000 to the leading local research project by Dr. Eugene YH Chan, of the Hong Kong Children's Hospital, on the topic: Prostacyclin analogue in patients with atypical haemolytic uraemic syndrome due to prostacyclin deficiency – using Patient-Derived Pluripotent Stem Cells as Platforms for characterization and treatments. [Post note: this project was not conducted due to manpower issues]



Kidney health for all: bridging the gap in kidney health education and literacy

The high burden of kidney disease, global disparities in kidney care, and poor outcomes of kidney failure bring a concomitant growing burden to persons affected, their families, and carers, and the community at large. Health literacy is the degree to which persons and organizations have or equitably enable individuals to have the ability to find, understand, and use information and services to make informed health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others. Rather than viewing health literacy as a patient deficit, improving health literacy largely rests with health care providers communicating and educating effectively in codigned partnership with those with kidney disease. For kidney policy makers, health literacy provides the imperative to shift organizations to a culture that places the person at the center of health care. The growing capability of and access to technology provides new opportunities to enhance education and awareness of kidney disease for all stakeholders. Advances in telecommunication, including social media platforms, can be leveraged to enhance persons' and providers' education. The World Kidney Day declares 2022 as the year of "Kidney Health for All" to promote global teamwork in advancing strategies in bridging the gap in kidney health education and literacy. Kidney organizations should work toward shifting the patient-deficit health literacy narrative to that of being the responsibility of health care providers and health policy makers. By engaging in and supporting kidney health-centered policy making, community health planning, and health literacy approaches for all, the kidney communities strive to prevent kidney diseases and enable living well with kidney disease.

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Given the high burden of kidney disease and global disparities related to kidney care, in carrying forward our mission of advocating *Kidney Health for All*, the challenging issue of bridging the well-identified gap in the global understanding of kidney disease and its health literacy is the theme for World Kidney Day (WKD) 2022. Health literacy is defined as the degree to which persons and organizations have—or equitably enable individuals to have—the ability to find, understand, and use information and services to inform health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others.¹ Not only is there is growing recognition of the role that health literacy has in determining outcomes for persons affected by kidney disease and the community in general, but there is an emergent imperative for policy makers worldwide to be informed and cognizant of opportunities and real measurable outcomes that can be achieved through kidney-specific preventative strategies.

The global community of people with kidney disease
Most people are not aware of what kidneys are for or even where their kidneys are. For those afflicted by disease and the subsequent effects on overall health, an effective health care provider communication is required to support individuals to be able to understand what to do, to make decisions, and to take action.

ORGAN DONATION

“Endless Love”

Memorial Garden at Junk Bay Chinese Permanent Cemetery.

HKKF is the main organiser of the Hong Kong Organ Donation Action Group. In July 2017, the Action group and the Board of Management of the Chinese Permanent Cemeteries (BMCP) launched the “Endless Love” [大愛恩人] Memorial Garden at Junk Bay Chinese Permanent Cemetery to honour the organ donors. The family can scatter the ashes of the donor

in the Garden. HKKF set up a memorial plaque for each of the donors. The group pays its respects to the organ donors twice a year at the Spring and Autumn memorial gathering.

Currently, we are honouring 62 deceased organ donors at the site.
