At the Annual General Meeting held on 25 July 2022, Prof Fok Tai Fai, Dr Lui Sing Leung, Ms Yvonne Lee and Ms Candy Chea were re-elected to the Board. Prof Francis Chan of The Chinese University of Hong Kong took up the post of Vice-President on 27 October 2022, after the retirement of Prof Fok Tai Fai who has served the board for 18 years as the representative from CUHK. Mr James Elms retired from the board having served the Foundation for 30 years. Mr Duncan Lee resigned from the board on 27 October 2022 having served the Foundation for 12 years. Dr Peter Chiu replaced Dr Eddie Chan as the representative from Hong Kong Urological Association. Mr Bill Wang joined the board on 25 July 2022.

CLINICAL SERVICE

(1) HAEMODIALYSIS SERVICE

In-centre haemodialysis

WoChe Centre (WCC) provides haemodialysis for patients with end-stage kidney failure at a subsided rate. The centre with 14 stations, operating 12 half-day shifts per week, can provide treatment for up to 67 patients.

The COVID outbreak has impacted the operation of WCC. At HKKF, the safety of our staff and patients remains our top priority, which includes preventing the spread of infection. As such, the extensive range of infection control measures implemented has successfully prevented any outbreaks of COVID infections at our centre.

Since March 2010, HKKF has supported the Hospital Authority Haemodialysis Public-Private Partnership Programme (PPP), providing haemodialysis for patients funded by the Hospital Authority.





As of 30 June 2023, 40 patients were receiving haemodialysis at WCC, of which 21 were HKKF patients, and 19 were patients from the Hospital Authority's PPP. The utilisation rate of the available sessions at WCC was 67% due to a reduction in patient numbers to avoid overcrowding, and the passing of other patients during the year. The WCC is now reopened for the admission of new patients.

During the 12 months ending 30 June 2023, 5,731 haemodialysis sessions were provided. The operation cost was approximately HKD\$1,900 per session.

The fee for HKKF patients was between HKD\$1,200 to HKD\$1,400 per session, depending on the type of dialysis and the dialyser used. HKKF provided a subsidy of approximately HKD\$80,000 per year to each patient, totalling HKD\$2 million per year.

HKKF received a donation of \$2 million from The Joseph Lau Luen Hung Charitable Foundation Limited to support the operation of WCC from 1 August 2021 to 1 July 2022.

Nocturnal home haemodialysis (NHHD)

Since 2007, HKKF has supported the NHHD programme run by the Hospital Authority. NNHD allows patients to perform self-care haemodialysis at home overnight for 3-4 nights per week.

Clinical outcomes and rehabilitation offer better results than the conventional twice or thrice-weekly haemodialysis sessions, with improved blood pressure control, anaemia reduction, and general blood test results.

HKKF provides each patient with a subsidy of HKD\$3,000 per month, while the Hospital Authority provides the consumables. Patients are required to contribute approximately HKD\$2000 per month.



Since 2007, HKKF has supported 111 patients, amounting to 568 years of treatment with an estimated 100,000 sessions of treatment. Around 21 patients have been on NHHD for over 10 years (the longest is 17 years). Currently, HKKF supports 41 out of a maximum of 60 patients on NHHD, requiring a subsidy amounting to HKD\$1.5 million per year.

HKKF has received HK\$ 2 million/year from Li Ka Shing Foundation for 2021 and 2022 to subsidise the patients in the NHHD Program.



2006: Mr Shum received a 2-month training for home haemodialysis.

- 1. Can be flexible when to have the haemodialysis treatment.
- Less restrictions on the diet.
- 3. No anaemia (no need for
- erythropoietin treatment).
- Not hypertensive (not on blood pressure drugs)
- Full rehabilitation, able to work, leading to a better life.

(2) AUTOMATED PERITONEAL DIALYSIS

The Automated Peritoneal Dialysis (APD) programme was launched in 1997 to provide patients with a form of peritoneal dialysis that can be carried out at home (with or without a caregiver) every night, with the APD machines performing the automated treatment throughout the night. This mode of dialysis is suitable for patients who work during the day and for those who require a caregiver to perform the dialysis. APD is an alternative mode of dialysis to Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis, in which the patient needs to perform fluid exchanges 3-4 times throughout the day.

Since 1997, HKKF has procured 1408 APD machines (equivalent to HKD\$118 million in value) via the donation of funds or machines. For the 12 months ending 30 June 2023, HKKF procured 146 APD machines, of which Baxter Healthcare Ltd. donated 58 machines to support the program. As of 30 June 2023, 1063 APD machines are in use.

Since its launch, HKKF has supported 2,627 patientsfor an estimated 2.5 million overnight



peritoneal dialysis treatments. On average, each patient receives APD treatment for three to four years, with some requiring treatment for up to ten years. In 2022, HKKF approved 348 applications for the APD programme.

HKKF has two APD programmes – (i) APD Free-loan programme and (ii) APD Co-Fund, Co-Use programme – for patients to use the APD machine at home every night.


Free APD Free-loan Programme 家居自動腹膜透析機免費借用計劃

This programme is for patients who meet the financial assessment criteria for a free loan of an APD machine - patients whose household income is not significantly higher than the median monthly household income, according to the HKSAR Domestic Households Survey.

The programme is supported by generous donations from individuals, organisations, pharmaceutical firms, and philanthropies (see Acknowledgement).

Since 1997, HKKF has supported 2406 patients through the APD Free-loan programme.

In 2022, HKKF approved 250 applications for the programme.



Home Automated Peritoneal Dialysis Machine Co-Fund Co-Use Programme (CFCU) 家居自動腹膜透析機 共融互用計劃

HKKF launched the CFCU programme on 1 Jan 2020 with a donation of HKD\$840,000 from Dr. Lui Siu Fai to procure 10 APD machines, which was matched by the donation of 5 APD machines by Baxter Healthcare Ltd. On 23 April 2020, the Estate of the late Cheung Ching Lan donated HKD\$4.2 million for HKKF to procure another 50 APD machines for the programme, which was matched by a donation of 25 machines from Baxter Healthcare Ltd. During 2023, HKKF received a further donation of HKD\$840,000 from Toi Shan Association of Hong Kong Charitable Foundation Ltd. and HKD\$840,000 from The Hong Kong Sze Yap Commercial & Industrial Association, with a donation of another 10 machines from Baxter Healthcare Ltd.

The CFCU programme caters for patients who do not meet the HKKF criteria for a free loan of an APD machine. These patients can apply to join the CFCU programme on the condition that they can contribute HKD\$2,333 per month to the CFCU Fund for a

maximum duration of 36 months. After completing the 36 months, the patient can continue to use the machine without further contributions to the CFCU.

On average, a patient may use the APD machine for three to four years, with some using it for up to 10 years or more. The machine is the property of HKKF and is re-circulated for use by patients for up to 10 years.

A patient's contribution of HKD\$2,333 per month for 36 months (HKD\$84,000) to the CFCU Fund enables HKKF to procure another APD machine for another patient to join the program, making it a self-sustaining programme.

As of 30 June 2023, 217 patients have joined the CFCU programme and have contributed HKD\$7 million to the CFCU fund. Currently, there are 167 patients on the CFCU programme.

(3) SUPPORTING PROGRAMMES FOR EXPENSIVE MEDICATIONS

Anti-rejection drugs for kidney transplantation - Prograf VI charity programme

Astellas Pharma Hong Kong Company Limited has donated a total of HKD\$8.28 million (accumulated since 2006 for the Prograf I-VI programmes) to HKKF to support patients requiring Prograf for kidney transplantation.

HKKF provides a subsidy of 50% of the cost of the drug to the patient. The programme has supported a total of 325 patients.

Erythropoietin for end-stage kidney failure patients (NESP)

Kyowa Kirin Hong Kong Company Limited has donated HKD\$2 million (accumulated since 2013) to HKKF to support patients with anaemia due to endstage kidney failure.

As of 30 June 2023, the programme has supported 483 patients (for 50% of the cost of the drugs).

Polycystic Kidney Disease Total Kidney Volume MRI Funding Scheme

Otsuka Pharmaceutical made a donation to subsidise patients for MRI scans.

EDUCATION AND RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

FOR HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

Central Commissioned Training Programme 7-8 Jan 2023

HKKF supported a 2-day programme organised by the Hospital Authority. The topic for 2023 was "Battling Chronic Kidney Disease: Measures Beyond Medicine". About 600 healthcare professionals attended the training.

HKKF Fellowship

Since 1995, HKKF has awarded Fellowship funds to 30 renal healthcare professionals (doctors and nurses) for overseas training. In 2022, HKKF approved three medical doctors for 6-12 months of overseas training during 2023-2024.

HKKF Eugenia Lee Education Scholarship


In 2013, HKKF received a donation of HKD\$1,000,000 from Ms Eugenia Lee to establish a scholarship for healthcare professionals to attend overseas courses in nephrology. A total of 29 doctors have been granted scholarships. Owing to COVID-19, HKKF has supported online programmes for healthcare staff.

Renal Nursing Course (PRCC) 2022-2023

HKKF supported a course organized by the HA Institute of Advanced Nursing from 17 March 2023 to 8 December 2023 for 99 attendees.

HKKF Renal Research Grant

In conjunction with the Hong Kong Society of Nephrology, HKKF awarded a Renal Research Grant of HKD\$60,000 to the leading local research project by Dr Gordon Chun Kau Chan of the Prince of Wales Hospital on circulating osteokines and the association with bone mass, frailty, vascular stiffness, and outcomes in peritoneal dialysis patients.



25th Anniversary of Hong Kong Kidney Foundation Home Automated Peritoneal Dialysis Charity Program

A press briefing was held on 11 December 2022 to share the work and the outcome of the program. Since 1 July 1997, HKKF has cumulatively procured 1298 Automated Peritoneal Dialysis machines 自動腹膜透析機 via monetary or in kind (machine) donations equivalent to HKD\$109 million, supporting the (i) Free loan program and (ii) Co-Fund Co-Use program.

The program has supported 2481 patients to conduct peritoneal dialysis at home every night of the week, amounting to an estimate of 2,340,000 treatments.

Endless Love

Memorial Garden at Junk Bay Chinese Permanent Cemetery

HKKF is the main organiser of the Hong Kong Organ Donation Action Group. In July 2017, the Action group and the Board of Management of the Chinese Permanent Cemeteries (BMCPC) launched the "Endless Love" [大愛恩人] Memorial Garden at Junk Bay Chinese Permanent Cemetery to honour organ donors. HKKF set up a memorial plaque for each donor at the memorial garden, where the ashes of the donors are scattered.

Currently, we are honouring 62 deceased organ donors at the site.

The group pays respect to the organ donors twice yearly during the Annual Spring and Autumn memorial ceremony.


